What?

Short-term, low-cost projects



Until the budget is exhausted [8.000 EUR]

The processing time is 2 weeks

How much?

From 50 to 500 EUR



Applicants submit their request by filling in the Google Form

Evaluation

Evaluation is done by the CEE Hub staff members

So far, we received 8 microgrants proposals

- 6 of them are funded
- 2 of them were withdrawn (unfunded)
- 5 different communities received funds, all of them were not recipients of WMF grants
