VÁCLAV HAVEL – First Czechoslovak and Czech President (1990–2003)

Select a text style and discuss, what are the differences between them. Explain how all the examples could be used on Wikimedia projects.

Example 1:

The November Revolution in 1989 put Václav Havel (5 October 1936 to 18 December 2011) in a situation he had never known before: he had to assume the role of a real politician, i.e. someone who addresses and leads the masses. The existential notion of public action as "living in truth" or so-called non-political politics was quickly replaced by a full-fledged struggle for power, both with the ending communist regime and within the broad anti-regime coalition. Indeed, the euphoria of the fall of communism was increasingly intertwined with the growing ambitions of groups and individuals. Václav Havel died exactly two years ago.

Example 3:

Dear fellow citizens,

Example 4:

Václav Havel (5 October 1936 Prague - 18 December 2011 Vlčice-Hrádeček) was a Czech playwright, essayist, dissident, critic of the communist regime and later a politician. He was the ninth and last President of Czechoslovakia (1989-1992) and the first President of the Czech Republic (1993-2003). Václav Havel worked at the Na zábradlí Theatre in the 1960s, where he was also famous for his plays *The Garden Party* (1963) and *Understanding* (1965). During the period around the Prague Spring, he became involved in political debate and advocated the introduction of a democratic society. After the violent suppression of the reforms by the military invasion of the Warsaw Pact states, he was banned from publishing and became one of the prominent dissidents and critics of the then normalizing regime.
